

## ORDINANCE 2

AN ORDINANCE TO RESTRAIN ANY PERSON FROM GIVING OR DEALING IN SPIRITUOUS MALT, FERMENTED OR VINOUS LIQUORS IN A LESS QUANTITY THAN FIVE GALLONS, WITHIN THE CITY OF MINNESOTA CITY, UNLESS DULY LICENSED BY THE CITY COUNCIL.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF MINNESOTA CITY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Whoever gives, barter, sells or disposes of any spirituous malt, fermented or vinous liquors in a less quantity than five gallons within the city of Minnesota City, without first having obtained a license therefor from the city council of said city, shall, on conviction thereof in any court having jurisdiction of the same, be fined for every such offense in any sum not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00), nor less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), and the imprisonment shall not exceed ninety days.

SECTION 2. All applications of license shall be made to the city council at some regular or special meeting, which application shall be presented by the city recorder and shall be accompanied by the city treasurer's receipt for the amount of the license, which shall be fixed by the city council; provided that no license shall be issued unless voted for by a majority of the city council, and a bond as required by general law and conditioned according to the laws of Minnesota, be filed with the city recorder; together with the approval of the President of the city council endorsed thereon. Provided further that any license so granted may by resolution at any time be revoked by the city council.

SECTION 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of the bond required to be given by him under section two of this chapter, shall on conviction thereof, be fined in any amount not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), and may at discretion of the court be imprisoned in jail until said fine and costs are paid, not exceeding ninety days.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect and remain in force from and after its passage.
