

## ORDINANCE 9

AN ORDINANCE TO RESTRAIN ANY PERSON FROM GIVING OR DEALING IN LEGALIZED MALT BEVERAGES IN A LESS QUANTITY THAN FIVE GALLONS WITHIN THE CITY OF MINNESOTA CITY UNLESS DULY LICENSED BY THE CITY COUNCIL

SECTION 1. (malt) Legalized beverages containing less than one-half of one percent alcohol by volume are excepted from the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 2. Whoever gives, barter, sells, or disposes of any legalized malt beverages in a greater quantity than five gallons within the city of Minnesota City without first having obtained a license therefore from the City Council, shall, upon conviction thereof in any court having jurisdiction of the same, be punished by a fine of not less than \$25 (Twenty-five dollars) nor more than \$100.00 (One Hundred Dollars) or imprisonment in the County jail for not less than thirty days nor more than ninety days.

SECTION 3. All applications for license shall be made to the City Council at some special or regular meeting. Which application shall be presented by the city recorder and shall be accompanied by the city treasurer's receipt for the amount of the license which shall be fixed by the City Council, provided that no license shall be issued unless voted for by a majority of the City Council. Provided further that any license so granted may by resolution at any time be revoked by the City Council.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect at 12:01 AM April 7, 1933 and remain in force until repealed or otherwise annulled.
