

ORDINANCE NO. 2

AN ORDINANCE TO RESTRAI ANY PERSON FROM GIVING OR DEALING IN SPIRITUOUS MALT, FERMENTED OR VINOUS LIQUORS IN A LESS QUANTITY THAN FIVE GALLONS, WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF MINNESOTA CITY, UNLESS DULY LICENSED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL.

THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF MINNESOTA CITY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Whoever gives, barters, sells or disposes of any spirituous malt, fermented or vinous liquors in a less quantity than five gallons within the village of Minnesota City, without first having obtained a license therefor from the village council of said village, shall, on conviction thereof in any court having jurisdiction of the same, be fined for every such offense in any sum not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00), nor less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), and the imprisonment shall not exceed ninety days.

SECTION 2. All applications of license shall be made to the village council at some regular or special meeting, which application shall be presented by the village recorder and shall be accompanied by the village treasurer's receipt for the amount of the license, which shall be fixed by the village council; provided that no license shall be issued unless voted for by a majority of the village council, and a bond as required by general law and conditioned according to the laws of Minnesota, be filed with the village recorder; together with the approval of the President of the village council endorsed thereon. Provided further that any license so granted may by resolution at any time be revoked by the village council.

SECTION 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of the bond required to be given by him under section two of this chapter, shall on conviction thereof, be fined in any amount not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), and may at discretion of the court be imprisoned in jail until said fine and costs are paid, not exceeding ninety days.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect and remain in force from and after its passage.
