

Ordinance No. 10

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SALE OF LEGALIZED MALT BEVERAGES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF MINNESOTA CITY

The Village Council do ordain as follows.

SECTION 1.

Legalized malt beverages containing less than one half of one percent alcohol by volume are exempted from the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 2.

No person shall give, barter, sell, or dispose of any legalized malt beverages within the Village of Minnesota City between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight and five o'clock AM.

SECTION 3.

Any person violation the provisions of section 2 of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less Twenty Five dollars (\$25.00) nor more than One Hundred dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment in the County jail for not less than thirty nor more than ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 4.

This ordinance shall take effect at 12:01 AM Apr, 7, 1933 and shall remain in force until repealed or otherwise annulled.

Ordinance #20 amends Ordinance #10

Section 4. No License shall be issued to any person who is not a citizen of the United States or who is under the age of twenty-one years or who, in the opinion and discretion of the City Council is not of good moral character and repute and who, in the judgment of the City Council, is not a fit or proper person to engage in such business, or who has not the necessary or proper location or equipment therefor.

No malt beverages shall be sold hereunder for consumption on the licensed premises between the hours of 7 o'clock a.m. and 11 o'clock a.m. on Sunday.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
