ORDINANCE NO. 26, Village of Minnesota City

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF MINNESOTA CITY, INCORPORATING PROVISIONS OF THE STATE HIGHWAY TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT BY REFERENCE, AND IMPOSING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

On motion of Art Nelton and seconded by Melvin Hohensee, the following Ordinance was adopted November 11, 1958.

The Council of the Village of Minnesota City do ordain as follows:

SECTION I. HIGHWAY TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT INCORPORATED BY REFERENCE.

The regulatory provisions of Minnesota Statutes, 1953, Chapter 169, as amended by Laws 1957, are hereby adopted as a traffic ordinance regulating the use of highways, streets and alleys within the Village of Minnesota City and are hereby incorporated in and made a part of this ordinance as completely as if set out here in full.

SECTION II. PENALTY

Any violation of the statutes adopted by reference in Section 1 is a violation of this ordinance when it occurs within the Village of Minnesota City. Any person thus violating any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed \$100.00 or by imprisonment in the County Jail for a period of not to exceed 90 days; but if a minimum fine or imprisonment is prescribed by the state highway traffic act for an offense, such penalty shall apply to a person convicted of the same offense under this ordinance.
