Minnesota City 1967 Ordinance No. 36.

LIMITING TRAILER USE

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE REGULATION OF HOUSETRAILERS, AUTOMOBILE CAMPS, AND COURTS.

The Village Council of the Village of Minnesota City ordains:

SECTION I. DEFINITION. For the purpose of this ordinance, certain terms used herein are defined as follows:

Housetrailer. Any automobile housetrailer, automobile truck or bus converted to living quarters or any moveable structure, dwelling, rooms or sleeping accommodation or quarters of any kind.

SECTION II. REGULATIONS. No person shall herein occupy a housetrailer as a dwelling or for sleeping accommodations or quarters within the village limits of the Village of Minnesota City provided that any property owner, who has been granted a building permit for the construction of a dwelling, may occupy a housetrailer on the premises on which such dwelling being constructed, for such period of time as shall be determined by the Council, but not to exceed six months during the said construction. No person shall hereafter maintain, keep or operate an automobile camp or court within the limits of the Village of Minnesota City.

SECTION III. PENALTY. Any person who shall violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punishable by a fine, not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment, not to exceed ninety (90) days for each offense.
