

ORDINANCE NO. 5

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING SALOONS, BOWLING ALLEYS AND BILLIARD ROOMS.

The Village Council of Minnesota City do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. That all saloons, and all other places where spirituous or malt liquors are sold or otherwise disposed of within the limits of the village of Minnesota City, shall be closed from the hour of eleven o'clock at night until four o'clock in the morning, and no liquor of any kind shall be sold, given away or otherwise disposed of, at any saloon, bar or drinking house within the village of Minnesota City, after the hour of eleven o'clock at night and four o'clock of the following day.

SECTION 2. No saloon, bar or other place where liquors are sold or otherwise disposed of, nor any billiard room, bowling or tenpin alley, shall be kept open, or any liquors sold or otherwise disposed of, or any game of billiards or tenpins, be allowed in any billiard room or bowling or tenpin alley in the village of Minnesota City on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday.

SECTION 3. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall for each such offense be punished by a fine not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and in default of payment of said fine shall be imprisoned in jail until said fine is paid, which said imprisonment shall not exceed ninety days.

SECTION 4. And no minors shall be allowed to shake dice, play pool, billiards or cards or lounge in or around saloons; and any saloon keeper or bartender shall not sell or give away any intoxicating liquors to a minor without its parent's consent.

SECTION 5. Any person violating any or the provisions of Section 4 of this ordinance shall on conviction thereof be fined not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), and in default of payment of said fine, shall be imprisoned in jail until said fine is paid, which said imprisonment shall not exceed ninety days.
