

ORDINANCE NO. 6

AN ORDINANCE TO LICENSE PEDDLERS AND HAWKERS IN THE VILLAGE OF MINNESOTA CITY.

The Village Council of the village of Minnesota City do ordain as follows:

SECTION I. That it will be unlawful for any person to peddle, hawk or offer for sale or retail in any lane, street or alley or market place or elsewhere in this village, any goods, wares, meats or merchandise, except wood, hay and agricultural produce, without first having obtained a license.

SECTION II. The license for selling or offering for sale as aforesaid, shall be at the rate of five dollars per month, or one dollar per day. Such license shall be obtained from the village Recorder, upon presentation to him of the village treasurer's receipt for the amount of such license, duly deposited, provided that no license be granted for less time than one day. The village recorder shall be entitled to twenty-five cents to be paid by the applicant, for each license made out by him under this ordinance.

SECTION III. Nothing in this ordinance nor in the license granted shall be so constructed as to entitle any person to the privilege of occupying a stand on any market place or street, lane or alley, or elsewhere in the village with tables, benches or otherwise, and every person offending against the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a penalty of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for each offense, and in default of payment of said fine be imprisoned in jail until said fine is paid, which said imprisonment shall not exceed ninety days.
